- PressReader provides **unlimited, 24/7 access to over 7000 newspapers and magazines from around the world** at no cost to library members.
- It delivers **full issues of premium newspapers and magazines** the moment they hit newsstands.
- The content is sourced from over **150 countries in 70+ languages**
- It includes major global titles like *The Guardian*, *The Dail Mail*, *The Telegraph*, *The Washington Post*, *The Globe*, *El Pais*, *Le Figaro*, *Newsweek*, *Vogue*, *Bloomberg Businessweek*, and *People*. **The New York Times and The Economist, Radio Times**



# ONE thing you need to know where people get confused

How do I confirm if I have connected to PressReader and can enjoy **complimentary** downloads of eNewspapers and eMagazines? To confirm this, look for a tea cup icon at the top right corner of the PR screen.

This tea cup icon will appear when you are connected to PressReader through the Library. Tap the tea cup to confirm that the access is being provided and see the remaining access time.

*Once the time has elapsed you and your borrowers MUST sign in again to get a further free access.*

**Borrowers NEVER have to pay.** If they are being asked then they are not signed into the Library Licence – again look for the green tea cup.


